THE ROOMS



Renowned for the personal attention its famed restaurants showed patrons for over eighty years, our space has provided the quintessential Los Angeles dining experience in the heart of Westwood Village. Skylight Gardens' brick Mediterranean revival structure is one of the oldest in Westwood. Its combination of strong architectural elements creates an intimate and welcoming Los Angeles atmosphere within the timeless beauty of a Tuscan estate.

A signature 30-ft. domed skylight and wraparound balcony overlook our main dining room and interior garden. Surrounding this is a gracious, multi-faceted space, including a sun-filled rotunda with a vaulted-wood ceiling, a library dining room, and an original limestone bar in the round. Generous natural light illuminates the space during the day, and stone fireplaces create a distinctly romantic warmth in the evening.

In 1933, the Talk of the Town Restaurant opened in this building. It earned our main atrium (then an outdoor courtyard) the title "La Ronda de las Estrellas" ("round court of the stars") for its part in Los Angeles' dining lore, while our private room – favored by Hollywood since the 30s for its discreet side-entrance – was called, simply, "The Studio."

Within five minutes' walk are some of the nation's most beautiful and prestigious theatrical venues; the world-renowned Geffen Playhouse (1929), the Spanish Mission-style Fox (1931) and Bruin (1937) Theaters – among the leading venues for film premieres in the history of cinema. Across the street are the Hammer Museum and Billy Wilder Theater.

Today, Skylight Gardens offers a new luxury culinary experience, in an atmosphere of characteristic "softness and romantic informality." And our outstanding cuisine, refined atmosphere, and exceptional service continue a great tradition.

The Studio

Skylight Gardens' historic private dining room was named for its popularity with film stars in the 30s, 40s and 50s. This elegant, tranquil space is ideal for formal dinners, receptions, seminars or screenings. Separated from the main atrium by glass doors and accessible by a side entrance, its enormous picture window faces the entrance to the Hammer Museum. Wifi enabled, with audiovisual, projection, and high-definition digital presentation capabilities complement the space.


